aquarium (n) a building, usually open to the public, that holds many aquariums

architect (n) a person whose job is to design new buildings and make certain that they are built correctly

bathing (n) the activity of going for a swim

castle (n) a large strong building, built in the past by a ruler or important person to protect the people inside from attack

cliffs (n) a high area of rock with a very steep side, often on a coast

esplanade (n) a wide level path, especially one by the sea

geologists (n) a person who studies geology

pebble (n) a small smooth round stone, especially one found on a beach or in a river

picturesque (adj) (especially of a place) attractive in appearance, especially in an old-fashioned way

pier (n) a long structure sticking out from the land over the sea, where people can walk or large boats can be tied, sometimes with restaurants and places of entertainment on it

regatta (n) a sports event consisting of boat races

resort (n) a place where many people go for rest, sport, or another stated purpose

sandy (adj) covered with sand or containing sand

seaside (n) the area near the sea, especially where people spend their holidays and enjoy themselves

shallow (adj) having only a short distance from the top to the bottom

tide (n) the rise and fall of the sea that happens twice every day

viewpoints (n) overlook a place from where a person can look at something, especially at an area of natural beauty:

yachting (n) the sport or activity of sailing yachts
